On completion of the education/training pathway, the holder of the certificate is able to:

Skills common to all licei:

- master the Italian language in various communication contexts, using different styles suited to different situations;
- communicate in a foreign language to at least level B2 (CEFR);
- produce different types of written and oral texts with respect to the activity carried out;
- identify problems and argue his/her own position, by critically assessing different viewpoints and putting forward potential solutions;
- demonstrate a good knowledge of the key aspects of the Italian and European literary, artistic, philosophical, religious culture and tradition, and be able to compare them with other traditions and cultures:
- act in accordance with the rights and responsibilities of a citizen, being aware of the cultural aspects and nature of both Italian and European political, legal, social and economic institutions;
- master the specific language and procedures of mathematics, physical and natural sciences;
- critically use ICT tools to carry out study and in-depth analysis activities, and for research and communication purposes;
- work in professional and interpersonal contexts, collaborating in work groups in a critical and proactive manner

Skills of the Music and Choreutic Lyceum - Ballet specialization:

- master the stage with self-control, and interpret independently and with technical and artistic in-depth knowledge the various languages of dance in collective performances and show staging;
- recognise music parameters with respect to different dynamic-rhythmic combinations of classical ballet and choreographic material from the repertoire;
- perform complex combinations of adagio, pirouette, changement, pointe and batterie, placing special
 emphasis on balance, endurance, plasticity of torso and expressive gestures, combining classical ballet
 technique with contemporary dance;
- identify the components of the classical ballet language and analyse its structure using appropriate terminology;
- perform short solo or group choreographic material of classical ballet, placing emphasis on the style and characterization of the character;
- identify and analyse the stylistic features and aesthetic values of the most important contemporary dance performances, taking into account the historical, cultural and social contextualisation.

Skills of the *Music and Choreutic Lyceum – Contemporary dance* specialization:

- master the stage with self-control, and interpret independently and with technical and artistic in-depth knowledge the various languages of dance in collective performances and show staging;
- recognise music parameters with respect to different dynamic-rhythmic combinations of a specific style of contemporary dance and choreographic material in the repertoire;
- interpret dynamic-rhythmic material in a personal way, in various space levels using falls in and out of the central axis, turns, jumps, suspensions and swing with different accents, by also combining the classical ballet technique with contemporary dance technique;
- perform material of contemporary works with suitable style and technique, making use of thematic improvisation, even for one or more interpreters;
- analyse different dance expressions based on space, time, energy and shape, with appropriate use of terminology and of the specific categories of dance;
- identify and analyse the stylistic features and aesthetic values of the most important contemporary dance performances, also taking into account historical, cultural and social contextualisation.

4. Range of occupations accessible to the holder of the certificate

The certificate holder can play either one of the following intermediate-level roles:

- dancer:
- assistant choreographer, assistant stage manager, theatre technician;
- researcher, dance critic at editorial offices, press offices, publishing houses, libraries, archives;
- entertainer at recreational and entertainment centres;
- dance expert at social promotion institutes and bodies, namely in the third sector;
- private school dance teacher;
- dance therapist, after completing special training.

Yearly school hours are divided into mandatory subjects and activities and optional subjects if provided for in the Educational Plan drawn up by each school.

Schools can allocate a percentage of the total hours of the national study plans (up to 20% in the first two years, 30% in the third and fourth years and 20% in the fifth year) to tailor curricula to local needs.

Schools can set up a scientific committee made up of teachers and work experts.

During the 5th year, a non-language-related subject is taught in a foreign language.

Activities and modules related to "Citizenship and Constitution" are envisaged in the historical-geographical and historical-social fields.
